



Introduction to FY2019 Annual and Express Grants

The grant programs are subject to change due to budget restrictions.

About MAC

Missouri Arts Council, a state agency, provides over \$4 million a year to nonprofit organizations through grants that meet our strategic goals:

- Engage people in meaningful arts experiences
- Grow Missouri's economy using the arts
- Strengthen Missouri education through the arts

MAC awards grants to organizations to stimulate the growth, development, and appreciation of the arts in Missouri. This funding makes possible quality arts programming to communities throughout Missouri. In addition to financial assistance, MAC provides expertise in community development, fundraising, marketing, grant writing, arts education, artistic disciplines (visual arts, music, literature, theater, dance, festivals, and film/media) and more.

Funding for the Missouri Arts Council is provided by the Missouri General Assembly through the state's annual budget bill approved by the governor, Missouri Cultural Trust and the National Endowment for the Arts.

What Does MAC Fund

MAC funds projects with an artistic component that are open to the public. Funds may be used for artist fees, artist travel expenses, marketing the arts event, project-related educational materials, and more.

A project can include the following:

- Performance of dance, music, opera, and/or theater (single performance or series)
- Arts festival or arts component at festival or county fair
- Literary journal publication
- Exhibition or exhibition series
- Film festival, film series, or production of media arts project
- Artist residencies (Arts Education)
- Educational programs

Express and Annual Grants

Express grants offer smaller funding amounts, a simpler application, and quicker response. This is designed for small projects, unexpected projects, one-time projects, and those that missed the annual deadline.

Annual grants offer larger funding amounts with a more extensive application and process. This is designed for larger projects, repeating projects, or operating support in certain cases.

Who May Apply

To be eligible to apply for MAC funding, an organization must:

- Be tax-exempt 501c3 as determined by the Internal Revenue Service and incorporated in Missouri as a not-for-profit corporation. You must maintain not-for-profit status by filing annual or biennial registration report with the Secretary of State's office. OR Be a unit of federal or local government, such as a school, university, library, or county agency.
- Conduct the proposed project in Missouri.

Additional requirements apply to organizations seeking funds for Accelerate, Arts Council (formerly Community Arts), Established Institutions, Folk Arts, Mid-Sized Arts Organizations, Minority Arts, and Partnership (formerly Arts Services) programs.

MAC accepts applications from the following types of organizations and/or agencies:

- Arts or arts education organizations
- Chambers of commerce
- Government agencies, parks, libraries
- Colleges and universities
- Social service organizations
- Religious organizations
- Youth organizations
- Public and private schools
- Community arts organizations
- City parks departments

Funding Criteria

Most projects are reviewed based on three weighted criteria: Artistic Quality, Community Involvement, and Management Ability. Arts Education criteria are different.

Application Deadlines

Missouri Arts Council’s strategic grants have monthly or annual deadlines.

- Express applications are accepted by the first Monday of each month for projects taking place at least two months after the deadline month (i.e., first Monday in January for projects taking place in March). Applications are accepted earlier.
- Annual application deadlines (submitted online):
 Annual Discipline Draft Application Last Monday in January
 Annual Discipline Final Application – **For FY2019 only March 12**; Normally Last Monday in Feb.
 Off Year Application – **For FY2019 only March 12**; Normally Last Monday in February

Applications that are incomplete (missing required answers, attachments or support materials) or improperly completed will not be considered for funding. We reserve the right to remove materials that do not comply with application requirements.

Grant Writing Assistance

New applicants are encouraged to submit a draft application. Even experienced applicants have found it useful to have their application reviewed by MAC staff. A draft application should include a completed application form and all required attachments. Including support material with your draft is recommended, but optional.

Participating in Accelerate does not count against your grant limit.

Schools may also apply for School Touring or Big YelPlow School Bus as part of their two grants.

Getting Started

1. Review the application and guidelines. Grant program information, guidelines, tips, applications, sample documents and forms are available on MAC's organization website - <http://missouriartscouncil.org>
2. Complete the application form online. Detailed instructions will be available soon. [Sign up for email list](#) to receive grant notifications, newsletter, and other updates about Missouri Arts Council.
3. Prepare attachments for the application.
4. Collect support material that addresses evaluation criteria.
5. Submit a draft by the last Monday in January. OPTIONAL
6. **Due to the new online grants system, the FY2019 deadline is March 12, 2018.** Make certain the final application and support material are submitted no later than **March 12, 2018**. Normally the deadline is the last Monday in February.

Express Deadlines			
Big Yellow School Bus	\$300	First Monday of Month	Supports transportation costs for one school field trip to MAC-supported arts programs.
Express Arts Council (formerly Community Arts)	\$3,000	First Monday of Month	Provides project support to community arts agencies outside the cities of St. Louis and Kansas City with multidisciplinary programs
Express Arts Education	\$2,000	First Monday of Month	Supports one artist in residence OR out of school OR professional development grant PLUS one school touring grant (\$1,000).
Express Minority Arts	\$3,000	First Monday of Month	Provides support for arts projects created by and/or targeted to African-American, Asian-American, Latino/Hispanic and Native American communities.
Express Project	\$2,000	First Monday of Month	Provides support for smaller arts projects with a simpler application and quick response.
Express Touring	\$3,000 total or 60% of artist fee	First Monday of Month	Enables communities to present the artists on MAC's Missouri Touring Roster, and allow those artists to perform in Missouri communities.

Accelerate	\$1,500	July	Provides needs assessment, action plan and funding to strengthen and grow arts organizations.
Arts Council (formerly Community Arts)	\$20,000 - \$35,000	For FY2019 March 12	Provides project or operating support to community arts agencies outside the cities of St. Louis and Kansas City with multidisciplinary programs
Arts Education	\$10,000	For FY2019 March 12	Supports artist in residence, out of school, and professional development programs in schools.
Discipline	\$30,000	For FY2019 March 12	Provides support to larger and ongoing arts projects in Disciplines including Dance, Electronic Media Arts, Festivals, Literature, Multidiscipline, Music (instrumental and vocal/presenter), Theater, and Visual Arts.
Established Institutions	\$300,000	For FY2019 March 12	Provides operating support for arts institutions with an annual budget greater than \$2 million. Other eligibility requirements apply. MAC will contact organizations that are eligible for this category.
Folk Arts	\$30,000	For FY2019 March 12	Provides support for the traditional folk arts of Missouri.
Minority Arts	\$30,000	For FY2019 March 12	Provides support for arts projects created by and/or targeted to African-American, Asian-American, Latino/Hispanic and Native American communities.
Mid-Sized Arts Organizations	\$50,000	For FY2019 March 12	Provides operating support for arts organizations with an annual budget greater than \$500,000. Other eligibility requirements apply. MAC will contact organizations that are eligible for this category.
Partnership (formerly Arts Services)	Varies, by invitation only	For FY2019 March 12	Supports programs and initiatives that are aligned with MAC strategic goals. Other eligibility requirements apply.
